







Nearly 1,000 families have been served since our inception in 1985

Since 1985, nearly \$1.5 million has been paid in property taxes to local communities by our homeowners

Approximately \$10 million in total affordable home mortgage loans have been made since 1985 for Habitat homes

Since 2017, over 220 amiles have been served through our Home Repair Program that offers low-income homeowners with basic home beautification, repairs, and improvements

22,000 hours of volunteer labor provided annually, translating into over \$320,000 of investment in our programs

The ReStore sells some 18,500 items monthly, the proceeds of which help us build more homes in the Central Valley

6,500 stakeholders are communicated with monthly

At any time, 15 New Nomes are under various stages of construction or repair

Through our workforce development program, we have served 350 individuals translating into over 4.250 hours of job training

a family's journey from cramped trailer to dream home

Lino and Magdalena Garcia-Pizano and their children lived in an outdated travel trailer for over five years before becoming Habitat homeowners in Madera. With only one bedroom, the family of six spent their nights split between a single bed and multiple flat boards Lino installed along the hallway walls for his children! Aside from minimal sleeping and storage space, the trailer lacked proper heating and cooling necessary for decent housing. Summers were a struggle with the intense Central Valley heat and winters saw the family bundled up in blankets for warmth. To ensure the entire family had shelter from the elements, even the refrigerator lived outside the trailer where it was constantly at the mercy of Mother Nature.

Now, they own a beautiful new home in Madera where four bedrooms and two bathrooms leave plenty of room for the children to play. Knowing they're safe with room to grow has brought peace of mind to these homeowners and their family. Mateo, their eldest son, has dreams of becoming a doctor. Lino Jr. has a knack for soccer and plans to take his passion to a professional height. Saul's favorite hobby is spending time with his mom playing games in his spacious bedroom. Little Rebeca, the youngest and only daughter, enjoys splashing around in her small backyard pool where she can run freely.

Lino and Magdalena remember what it was like when learning they had been selected to partner with Habitat Greater Fresno Area on building their new home. The tears of joy they expressed while seeing their children celebrate the news was just the beginning of realizing their dream. Although they officially became homeowners in early 2022, their adventure didn't end there—this Habitat family can now focus on helping their incredible children reach their goals through safe, decent, and affordable shelter!

For many families, the thought of buying a home can seem impossible. Habitat for Humanity helps ready families for the responsibility of homeownership and what it means financially.

We partner with hard-working, low-income families that are unable to escape their current living conditions and acquire a mortgage through traditional means. Many of the families we serve live in deplorable housing situations that include overcrowding, lack

of heating or cooling, leaky roofs, uncontrollable mold growth, broken plumbing, and other structural deficiencies. No families should ever live in those conditions in our community. We provide families with the opportunity to buy their own home, which provides a foundation for life. A home changes a family's trajectory immediately and for generations.

Our homes are not given away. We give the families we serve a "hand up" not a "hand out." Our homeownership process carefully identifies vulnerable families and restores their sense of pride and accomplishment. Applicants must have a demonstrated need, and a minimum credit score. Habitat's homebuyers must put in 500 hours of Sweat Equity by assisting in the building of their own home, their neighbors' homes, or in our ReStore retail outlet. Through down payment assistance and low market

rate home loans from our financial partners, we offer buyers affordable mortgages that are often lower than their current rent. As a result, the dream of homeownership becomes attainable.

more than

of Fresno and Madera counties' residents are "rent-burdened"; they are spending an extremely high percentage of their gross income on housing-related costs. This leaves minimal funds for clothing, food, and other necessities designed to help a family move forward and leave poverty behind.

neighborhood revitalization
